“Control of the air gives a military power the opportunity to exploit height, reach and speed, enabling informed decision-making, the ability to strike freely at a distance, and the ability to maneuver unconstrained by the limits of terrain or ocean”, said Dr. Richard P. Hallion, former Air Force Historian and senior advisor for air and space issues with the Directorate for Security, Counterintelligence and Special Programs Oversight.

A few months after the D-Day invasion in June 1944, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower surveyed the Normandy beaches with his son. "You'd never get away with this if you didn't have air supremacy," then 2nd Lt. John Eisenhower told his father. "Without air supremacy," the elder Eisenhower replied, "I wouldn't be here."

When David faced Goliath he moved in the principle of air supremacy, he did not win the fight when the rock struck the head of the giant. David won the fight when he prophesied his victory (1 Sam. 17:45-47) the air supremacy was established. David hit the giant with an aerospace weapon - a rock at a distance.

God is a man of war (Ex. 15:3) and the greatest mastermind strategist. When the Scriptures refer to the “heavenly host,” we usually think of “choirs of angels.” The word “host” in the Bible means “army” ([Josh. 5:13–14](#)). It is an important truth: the hosts of Heaven are worshiping warriors.

1. Evil spirits have to leave when we worship the Lord - 1 Sam. 16:23 (David)
2. Chains are broken and prison cells open when we worship God - Acts 16:25 (Paul & Silas)
3. Shouts and Trumpets brought the walls of Jericho down - Joshua 6:12-16 (Joshua)
4. Shouts and Trumpets defeated the enemies of Israel - 2 Chron. 13:12-15 (Judah)
5. Worship and Praise destroyed the enemies of Israel - 2 Chron. 20:21-22 (Jehoshaphat)

What is the Key of David?

The figure of David, in the Bible, holds many prophetic words and a great importance regarding the covenant God made with him (2 Sam. 7:16). However, the most significant factor of the story of David was his passion to worship God. His entire life was about worship.

When David became King his first military strategy was to enthrone the King of Glory with continual worship - See 1 Chronicles chapters 11 through 16. During the time that David was King there was worship 24/7 in Israel, someone was worshipping God at all times, always. David literally established air supremacy by enthroning God with worship (Psalm 22:3).

We all know that to have a key is to have control and authority to open or to close, to grant access or to deny it.

“I will place on his shoulder the Key to the house of David, what he opens no one can shut, and what he shuts no one can open.” - Isaiah 22:22 & Rev. 3:7

- “Judah shall go first” says the Bible in Judges 1:1-2, 20:18, and Num. 2:9. War-ship is to go before us, worship declarations, proclamations and praises invade the atmosphere and releases heaven.
- David was from the Tribe of Judah. He is the best personification in the Bible of a worshiper. His military power came from the air supremacy he created. David was not limited by ground rules because he unlocked Heaven, he used his key and accessed the Armies of God.
- The Lord is announcing “I will restore the Tabernacle of David” - Amos 9:11-12
- Acts 15:16

“After this I will return, and will build again the Tabernacle of David, which is fallen down, and the ruins thereof will I build again, and I will set it up.”

David used his Key to bind the strongman, just read Psalm 18 and you will have a better understanding how he took air supremacy with his worship and destroyed all of his enemies. Though best of all David crowned God as the King of Glory in his nation and made everyone worship the Lord.

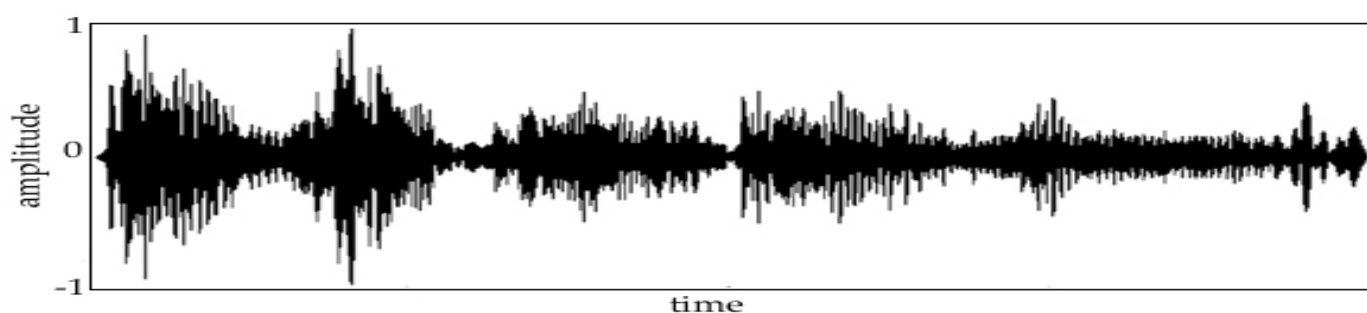
“How can anyone go into a strong man’s house
and steal his property unless he first overpowers
and ties up the strong man?
Then he will ransack *and* rob his house”.
Math. 12:29, Mark 3:27, Luke 11:21-22

Jesus was taken to the wilderness by the Spirit (Matthew 4:1-11) and what happened there was a confrontation for air supremacy. It was necessary for Jesus to change the atmosphere and bind the strong man first before his ministry began manifesting and people be saved.

Worship: Sound creates movement and light

One of the most important facts to understand about both, light and sound, is that both are forms of energy and they move in waves. Sound and light travel at significantly different speeds. Light waves move at speeds that are nearly one million times faster than sound waves are capable of traveling. "Sonoluminescence" occurs when a sound generates light.

Sound waves are much different than light waves in the manner in which they travel. Sound waves are also different in the sense that they travel through any type of substance whether solid, liquid or gas whereas light travels best through empty space. When sound waves hit materials they cause vibrations, they can be high frequency or low frequency.



Sound is a pressure disturbance that moves through a medium in the form of mechanical waves. When a force is exerted on an atom, it moves from its rest or equilibrium position and exerts a force on the adjacent particles. These adjacent particles are moved from their rest position and this continues throughout the medium. This transfer of energy from one particle to the next is how sound travels through a medium. The words "mechanical wave" are used to describe the distribution of energy through a medium by the transfer of energy from one particle to the next.

Waves of sound energy move outward in all directions from the source. Your vocal chords and the strings on a guitar are both sources which vibrate to produce sound waves. Without energy, there would be no sound.

Heaven comes to earth as we release a Worship Sound, the Frequency of Heaven.

Acts 2:2 "and suddenly a **sound** came from heaven like a rushing violent wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting"

1 Kings 18:41 "Now Elijah said to Ahab, "Go up, eat and drink, for there is the **sound** of the roar of an abundance of rain."

2 Kings 7:6 "For the Lord had caused the army of the Arameans to hear a **sound** of chariots and a sound of horses, even the sound of a great army"

1 Chron. 14:15 "It shall be when you hear the **sound** of marching in the tops of the balsam trees, then you shall go out to battle, for God will have gone out before you to strike the army of the Philistines."

Ezekiel 37:7 "So I prophesied as I was commanded; and as I prophesied, there was a **sound**, and suddenly a rattling; and the bones came together, bone to bone.
